- take into account the virtual dimension of "community policing"
- analyse its underlying social, cultural, legal and ethical dimensions.
- should aim to develop a technology to which facilitate, strengthen and accelerate the communication between groups making it possible for community representatives to identify the risk and immediately report it to the police.
